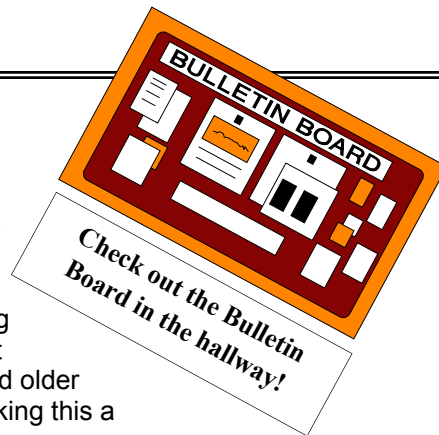


VBS and Summer Sunday school News

News from Adult Spiritual Formation

We are starting a new program for Adults beginning Sunday, July 11 at 9:15am and ending Sunday, August 15. It's a short term Summer Sunday School for Adults. We're going to have a lot fun with laughter, good times and hopefully experience spiritual growth. Following is a list of the classes that we will be offering:

We're changing the name of the Rector's Forum for Summer programming as well as for next year's programming. This class will be called the Sunday Forum and will meet in All Saints' Hall. During this time Washington Attorney, Sonia Privette, will facilitate this class. This term the class will be discussing the following three subjects, "Are we guaranteed health and wealth?"; "Prosperity and Faith" – in this program they will examine the spiritual challenges of wealth and consumption; Lastly, this group will discuss "A Biblical Perspective on Money" and thus will be confronting the challenge of stewardship.

This class is ideal for those who enjoy exploring a wide variety of subjects. It's also ideal for those who are newcomers and are visiting Saint Peter's for the first time and trying to discover a special place just for them.

The Young Adults Class meets upstairs in the Rena B. Harding Room. Class members share in the teaching responsibility. This group will be discussing "Communication in Marriage". Specifically they will be looking at "The Importance of Compromise" and "Grace Connects Men and Women."

This class is ideal for couples or singles from 23 to 30, 40, 50 or so. This is a very friendly group and newcomers will feel right at home. This class has a strong sense of Christian Community and belonging.

The Class that meets in the Woolard Meeting Room will be facilitated by Eddy Browning. This class will be studying the top five most popular single issue Sunday School classes in the United States as recorded by Christian Book Sellers and the George Gallup organization. They will be doing one issue a week and then moving on to the next issue.

Week one: Signs of Stress – Stress can affect your body, thoughts, feelings, and behavior. But when you learn to recognize common stress symptoms, you can take steps to manage them.

Week two: A Resurrection That Matters – Our salvation before God stands on the Cross, yes. But it is also founded on something more.

Week three: The Gospel, a Napkin, and Four Circles – Is our Gospel too small?

Week four: Expectant Prayer – What should we expect from prayer, and what are our responsibilities?

Week five: The Myth of the Perfect Parent – Why faithfulness, not perfection, must be the goal in raising our children.

This class is ideal for those seeking community, love, joy and laughter, an in depth study based upon Biblical precepts and spiritual growth. The age range is from 20 to 30, 40, 50, 60, 70, and 80.

You are encouraged to come and bring a friend to any of these three Adult offerings. You will enjoy yourself, meet and make new friends and along the way, you will grow spiritually.

Please bring your Bible to each of these classes if you like. Bibles are also available.
